THE SEASON OF CREATION

When I saw this year's theme for the Season of Creation, I thought, "This was created for our synod and its many rivers!" But first, what is this season? The Season of Creation is the annual Christian celebration to listen and respond together to the cry of Creation: the ecumenical family around the world unites to pray and protect our common home. The Season "Celebration" begins on September 1, the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on October 4, the Feast of St. Francis, the patron saint of animals and ecology beloved by many Christian denominations.

From the website, "the Prophet Amos cries out: 'But let justice roll on like a river, righteousness like a never-failing stream!' (Amos 5: 24), and so we are called to join the river of justice and peace, to take up climate and ecological justice, and to speak out with and for communities most impacted by climate injustice and the loss of biodiversity. As the people of God, we must work together on behalf of all Creation, as part of that mighty river of peace and justice."

Your worship planning team might enjoy selecting from our many great hymns about creation. You could worship once outside and/or with ecumenical partners. Or, instead of emphasizing the season during worship, you might read a book (see resources on the Lutherans Restoring Creation website) or revisit the ELCA's 1993 Social Statement: Caring for Creation. 2ND HARVEST MOBILE MARKET

On September 29, FLC will participate in Second Harvest's "Mobile Market" free food distribution program. This "drive-through" event will be held from 11 AM to 1 PM behind the church off Ontario Street serving up to 250 families while supplies last.

Since 2006, 2nd Harvest's Mobile Market program has been bringing free, healthy food to families, children and seniors experiencing food insecurity throughout the Inland Northwest. During the distribution, nutrition educators and trained "Nutrition Ambassador" volunteers offer food samples, cooking demonstrations and recipes.

This type of nutrition education intervention encourages fresh produce consumption and helps people move from hunger to health and self-sufficiency.

COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS, 9-13-2023

Pastor Services: It was determined that FLC would reimburse pastors for 10 hours of their services per month, with Pastor Dave working 4 hours on Thursdays and during that time doing a bible study for Memory Care at Luther Park.

Worship: Going forward, Pastor Barbara will preach the first two Sundays and Pastor Dave the last two Sundays of the month, and all services will begin at 9 AM beginning October 1.

Property: WIFI has been changed to Vyve and should give us better service. Because of an issue with transferring our phone number, we've been given a temporary number – 208-627-5778 – until this is resolved.

Faith Formation: Bible studies are starting back up after taking the summer off. We'll be looking into a suggestion to have a men's bible study again.

Luther Park: Assisted Living is full. We have the staff now for Memory Care and are working to fill those units (half-full).

We are waiting for the State of Idaho to finish changing our license into Luther Park's name from Ecumen.

The elevator is out of alignment and will cost about \$6,000 to fix. We also need to upgrade the cooling system for the memory bank of the elevator.

We are looking to hire another maintenance assistant.

New Business: The Teen Center would like have their after school program for 7-12 graders at FLC, paying rent for use of the fellowship hall and kitchen on weekdays from 2:30 to 5:30 PM (earlier on Fridays for early release). Three or four adults would supervise at all times and leave everything in order. A committee will be formed to look into this request.

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE SUPPORTS UKRAINE FARMERS & FAMILIES

Lutheran Disaster Response, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America's ministry providing short- and long-term recovery when disasters strike in the United States and around the world, is responding to urgent humanitarian needs and supporting agricultural livelihood recovery in Ukraine though a \$1 million grant to Lutheran World Relief, a Corus International organization.

The Supporting Farmers to Restore Resilient Livelihoods in Kharkiv (SPARRK) project will run through November 2024 and is centered in Kharkiv Oblast, one of the first regions targeted by the Russian offensive and where Ukrainian forces have reclaimed thousands of square kilometers of territory.

The funding will significantly scale up existing Lutheran World Relief humanitarian response operations in Kharkiv, more than doubling the number of families that will receive critical support. SPARKK will reach more than 7,000 families, including returnees, residents that remained in Kharkiv, and families who fled their homes and now reside in Kharkiv.

"Even as the Russia-Ukraine war continues, the SPARRK project will provide concrete support for families in Kharkiv and serve as a sign of hope for the future of Ukraine as crops are planted and farms reestablished. Lutheran Disaster Response is glad to support the SPARRK project as part of our commitment to long-term recovery," said Maryn Olson, Director, Lutheran Disaster Response.

Support includes both material and technical resources to restore or establish small farms and prepare for the harsh winter season. Participants in the project are receiving inputs depending upon their needs, like vegetable seeds, gardening tools, canning kits and pickling containers, chicks, chicken coops and feeders. Local agriculture advisors are providing training in small-scale, climate-sensitive farming practices that can include planting, composting and harvesting, and winterization preparedness, which involves drying, packaging and storing crops. Additionally, farm restoration grants will be issued to households that have lost assets as a result of the war and require a financial boost to expand their farming. ITEMS NEEDED FOR SCHOOL KIT BAGS

The next shipping date for Lutheran World Relief is October 20. I have not gotten very many school kit bags made, but if the items to fill them come in, I will crank out as many as we can fill. Now is the best time to buy them.

The required items are:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" x 10 1/2", no loose-leaf paper;
- One 30-centimeter ruler or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other;
- One pencil sharpener;
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well);
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers;
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink);
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons;
- One 2 ½ " eraser.
